



CITY OF MISSISSAUGA NOTICE OF ONLINE PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT Little Etobicoke Creek Flood Evaluation Study and Master Plan

WHAT?

- The City of Mississauga is in the process of finalizing the Little Etobicoke Creek Flood Evaluation Study and Master Plan. The Study was conducted under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) process and consists of two phases.
- Phase 1 expands on previous studies to identify the extents of flooding as a result of spilling from the Little Etobicoke Creek during high flow conditions.
- Phase 2 aims to identify the overland urban flooding risk and identify, assess, and recommend mitigation measures.

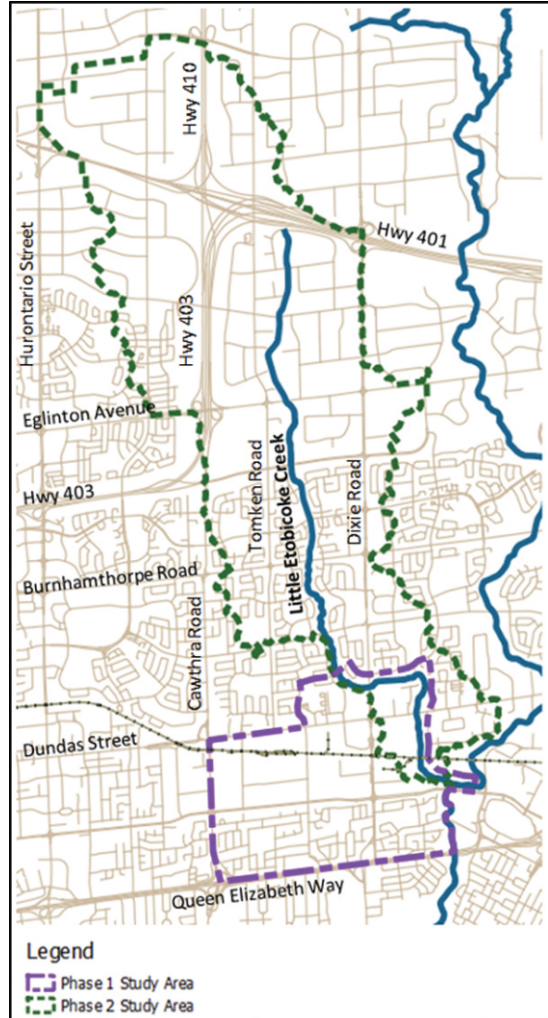
WHY?

- To recognize and account for the spill originating near Dixie Road and Dundas Street during high flow conditions.
- To identify areas at risk of flooding.
- To develop a plan to mitigate flood risk to people, property and infrastructure.

HOW?

- A spill assessment was conducted for Little Etobicoke Creek near Dixie-Dundas (Phase 1 Study Area), to determine the extent of flooding for the design and Regional storms.
- In the Phase 2 Study Area, the Project Team identified the existing areas that are at high risk of flooding during storm events (flood clusters).
- Multiple mitigation alternatives for the Phase 2 area are being evaluated by the Project Team and will be refined through public and agency consultation (see below). The Project Team will then select a set of Preferred Alternatives that will be recommended in the Master Plan.
- At the end of the study, a Master Plan Report documenting the entire study process will be available for public review.

- As part of the project, online public engagement has been arranged to allow local residents and interested members of the public an opportunity to review the project findings/alternative solutions and provide input that will support the Master Plan.
