
Canadian Navigable Waters Act

The City of Mississauga hereby gives notice that a submission has been added to the Common Project Search (online registry) pursuant to the *Canadian Navigable Waters Act* described herein and its description.

Pursuant to paragraph 4.1 and 9.1 of the said Act, the City of Mississauga has deposited with the Minister of Transport, on the on-line Common Project Search Registry (<http://cps.canada.ca/>) and under registry number 12237, a description of the following work:

New active transportation bridge with dedicated cycle and pedestrian lanes, located across the Credit River at approximately 43° 33' 5.400" N x 79° 35' 29.472" W, from Front Street North to Port Credit Memorial Park in the City of Mississauga, in the Province of Ontario.

The bridge will be a single span integral abutment slab-on-steel-girder bridge. Piers are being constructed clear of the ordinary high water mark. The bridge clearance is greater than that of the adjacent bridges both upstream and downstream.

There will also be replacement of an existing storm sewer and relocating storm sewer outfall into the Port Credit River. A cofferdam will be erected on the west bank of the river to construct the storm sewer outfall. The cofferdam will be in a shallow portion of the river and will not restrict navigation on the river.

The bridge girders will be launched from the west bank. It will take approximately one day to push the bridge all the way over the river. No navigation will be permitted under the bridge crossing during this activity. The City will coordinate with the local rowing and canoe clubs to ensure that this activity will not impact their members.

Once the bridge girders are across the river and in their final position, the deck will be constructed. A debris collection system will be suspended from the girders. Canoes, kayaks, and rowboats will be permitted to navigate the river under the bridge for the remainder of the construction.
