INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To: Diana Rusnov, City Clerk

We have audited the Statement of Campaign Period Income and Expenses, and the Calculation of Surplus or Deficit of Ehsan Khandaker for the campaign period from April 5, 2024 to July 25, 2024 relating to the election held on June 10, 2024. These financial statements are the responsibility of Ehsan Khandaker, candidate for Mississauga Ward 5 Councillor.

Candidate's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The Candidate is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with the financial reporting provisions of the Municipal Elections Act, and for such internal control as we determine is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditors' Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditors' judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the candidate's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the candidate's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates made by the candidate, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Due to the inherent nature of the transactions inherent in an election campaign, the completeness of the various categories of income and expenses is not susceptible to satisfactory audit verification. Accordingly, our verification of income and expenses was limited to the amounts recorded in the records of the Candidate and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to income and expenses and surplus/deficit. As well, the Act does not require me to report, nor was it practicable for me to determine, that contributions reported only include those which may be properly retained in accordance with the provision of the Act.

Qualified Opinion

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph,

the financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the income and expenses for the campaign period ended July 25, 2024, and the determination of surplus or deficit in accordance with the financial reporting provision of the Municipal Elections Act.

Basis of Accounting

Without modifying my opinion, we draw attention to the fact that these financial statements are prepared to assist the Candidate to meet the requirements of the Municipal Elections Act. As a result, the financial statements may not be suitable for another purpose.
